A RAP demonstrates to the community that your school or early learning service is forward thinking about reconciliation and committed to making positive change. Narragunnawali guides teachers, educators and community members through the development and implementation of a RAP. The process is flexible and can be tailored to meet the needs of the school or early learning services, and the local community.

Curriculum Resources

Narragunnawali provides resources to promote reconciliation and to strengthen children and students' knowledge and understanding of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders histories, cultures and contributions. The resources are aligned to the Early Years Learning Framework and the Australian Curriculum and can be used as is, or adapted to suit the local context

Professional Learning

Narragunnawali provides a wide range of professional learning resources for teachers and educators to support the implementation of reconciliation initiatives in the classroom, around the school and with the community. These resources assist teachers and educators to meet the National Quality Standard (early learning educators) and the Australian Professional Standards for Teachers (primary and secondary school teachers)
