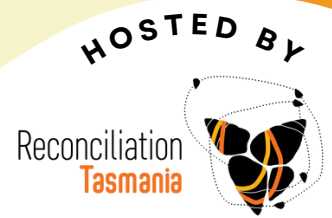


# WALKING THE TALK

## Workshop Information

This 4 hour innovative workshop builds on participants' awareness of the Tasmanian historical and contemporary context from *Come Walk With Us* to explore the meaning of 'cultural awareness', 'cultural safety' and 'cultural competence' and learn skills to put these important concepts into practice.



### Pre-requisite

Participants need to complete *Come Walk With Us* (or *Gumnuts to Buttons*) before attending *Walking the Talk*.

### Content

This workshop covers topics and themes including:

- Cultural awareness
- Cultural safety
- Cultural competence

### Evaluation and debrief

All participants will be asked to complete a short pre- and post-workshop questionnaire to evaluate their learning, and provide participants with opportunities to ask questions and/or give feedback.

Reconciliation Tasmania will collate the responses. The facilitator will present the outcomes in a debrief session with the leaders of the participant group, to assist in identifying next steps for your organisation.

### Pricing 2024 - 2025

\$150 plus GST per person, group of 9 – 18  
\$120 plus GST per person, group of 18 - 36

*Our fees don't include travel or accommodation expenses (if applicable). Where possible we provide facilitators based in your area. Any travel expenses are charged at cost, calculated using the ATO approved rate per km (88 cents per km in 2024-25). If an overnight stay is required – including where this is necessary for safety reasons to avoid facilitators driving before 7.30am or after 7.30pm – accommodation expenses are charged at cost. This includes the cost of meals (up to \$50 per meal; not including alcoholic beverages). Once workshop dates and locations are confirmed, an estimate is provided of applicable travel and accommodation expenses. Copies of receipts for accommodation and meals can be provided on request.*

### Outcomes

- Understanding of the meaning and significance of 'cultural awareness', 'cultural safety', and 'cultural competence'
- Deeper understanding of the lived experience of Tasmanian Aboriginal people, through history and today, and how this can affect interactions between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people
- Awareness of available pathways to learn more about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, cultures, knowledges and histories
